## 1 HISTORY AND AIMS

- ✓ **Founded in 1992** by Jordi Nadal (1929-2020), arguably the most important Spanish economic historian of the 20th century.
- ✓ **Promotes historical research** into the processes of industrialization and the social, economic, institutional, environmental, and demographic transformations associated with them.
- ✓ **Global in scope**, welcoming full-length articles on all world regions, contributing to established debates, and highlighting new research directions.
- ✓ **Supports methodological diversity**, with submissions that range from historical macroeconomic analysis to business history, incorporating both qualitative and quantitative approaches, including cliometrics.
- ✓ **Fully open access**, publishing original papers in English and Spanish in three regular issues each year, as well as special issues, and provides a book review section.
- ✓ **Early View service** allows completed articles to be published online ahead of the print issue, ensuring timely access to the latest research.

- ✓ **≈ 50 K** downloads/views from the website per year, distributed regionally as follows: Europe: 41%; the Americas: 41%, Asia: 17%, Africa and Oceania: 1%.

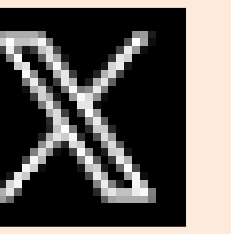

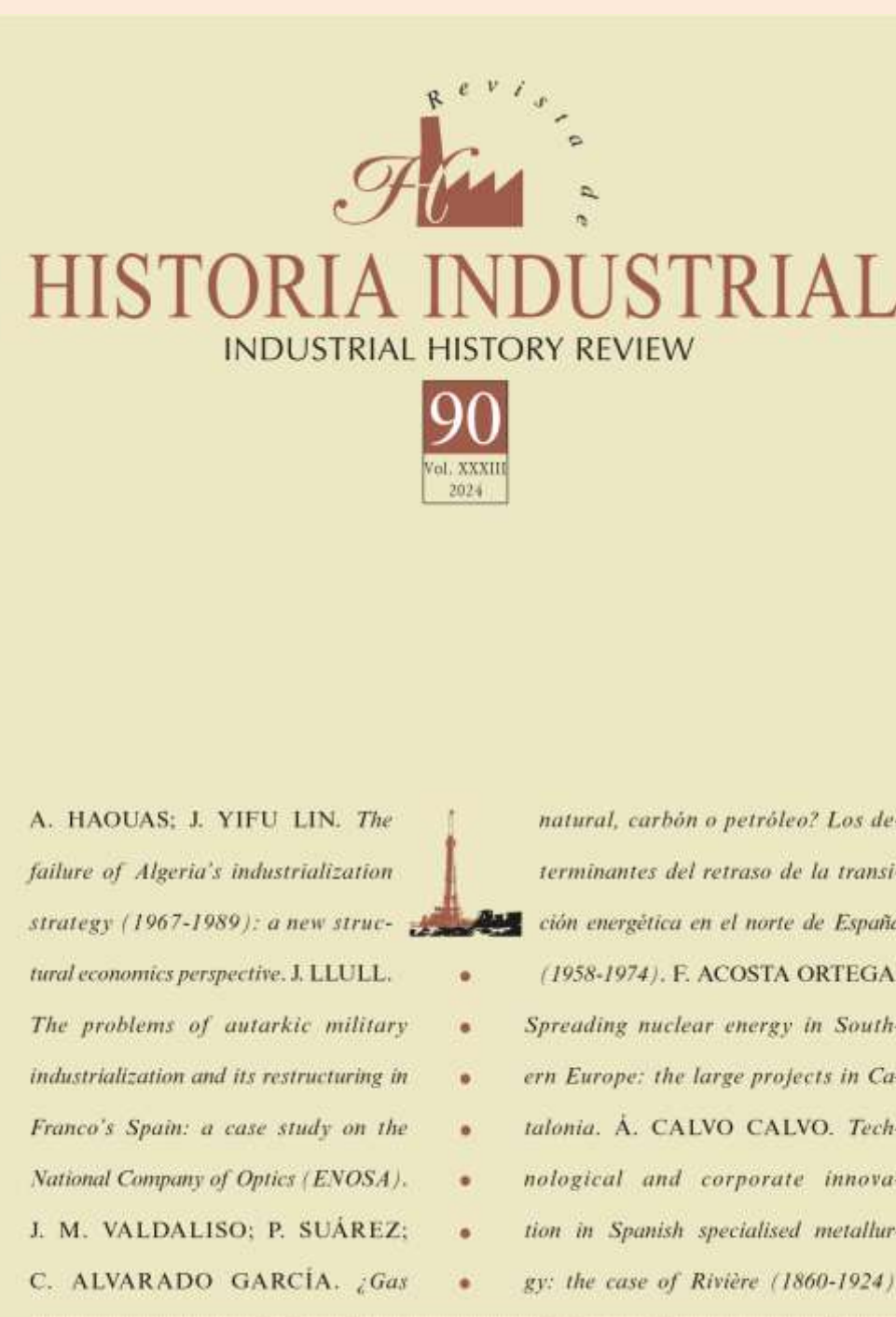
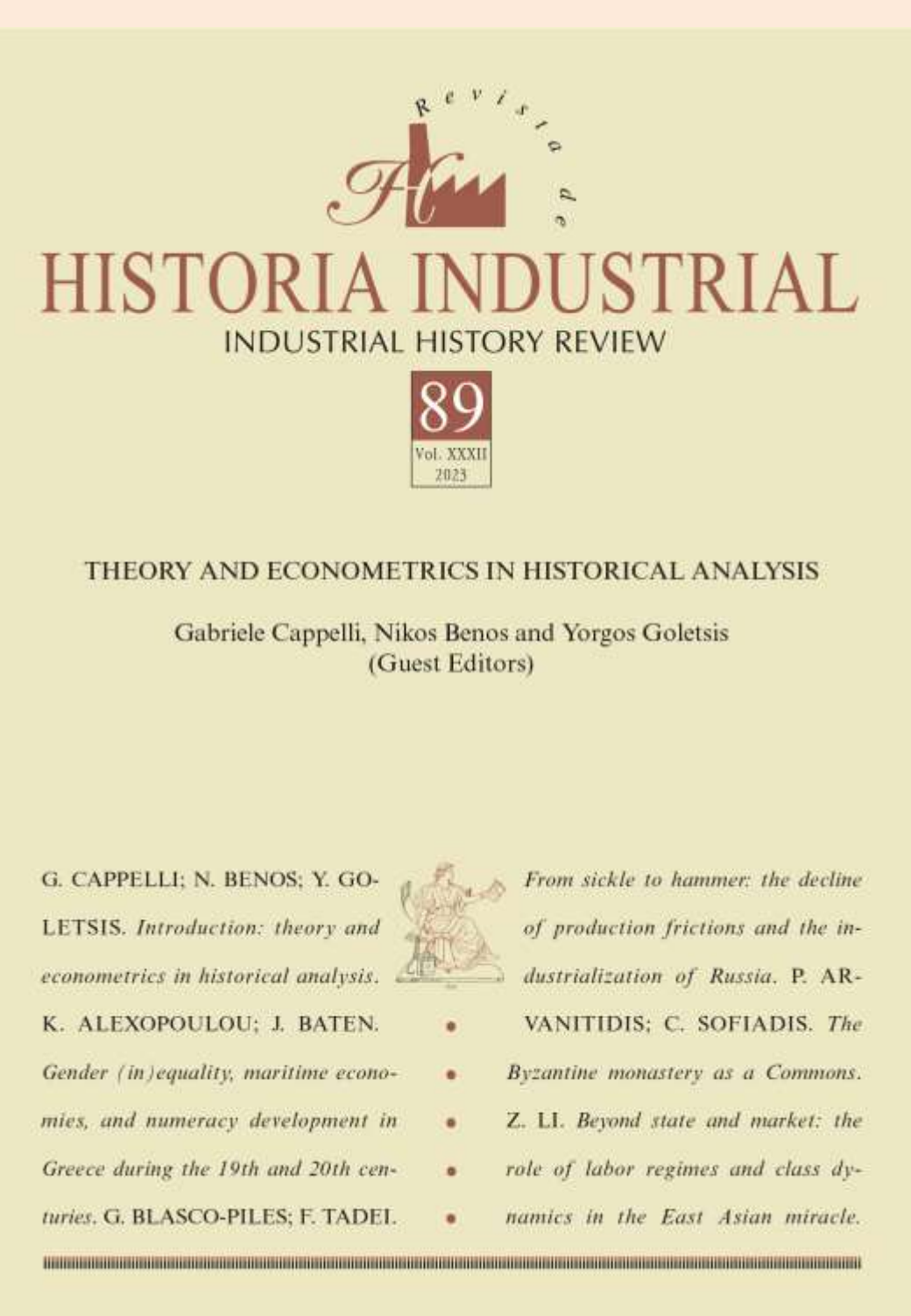
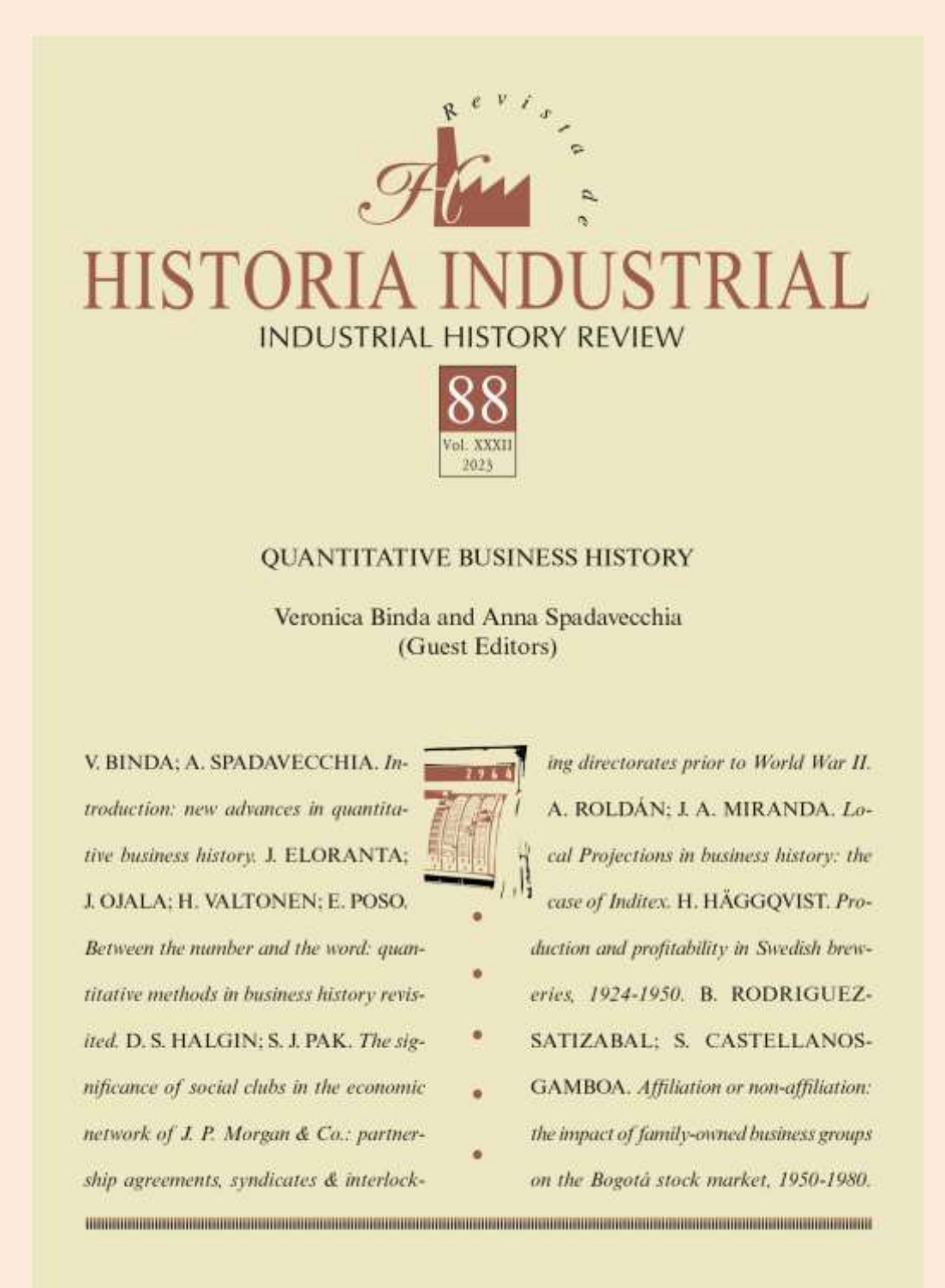
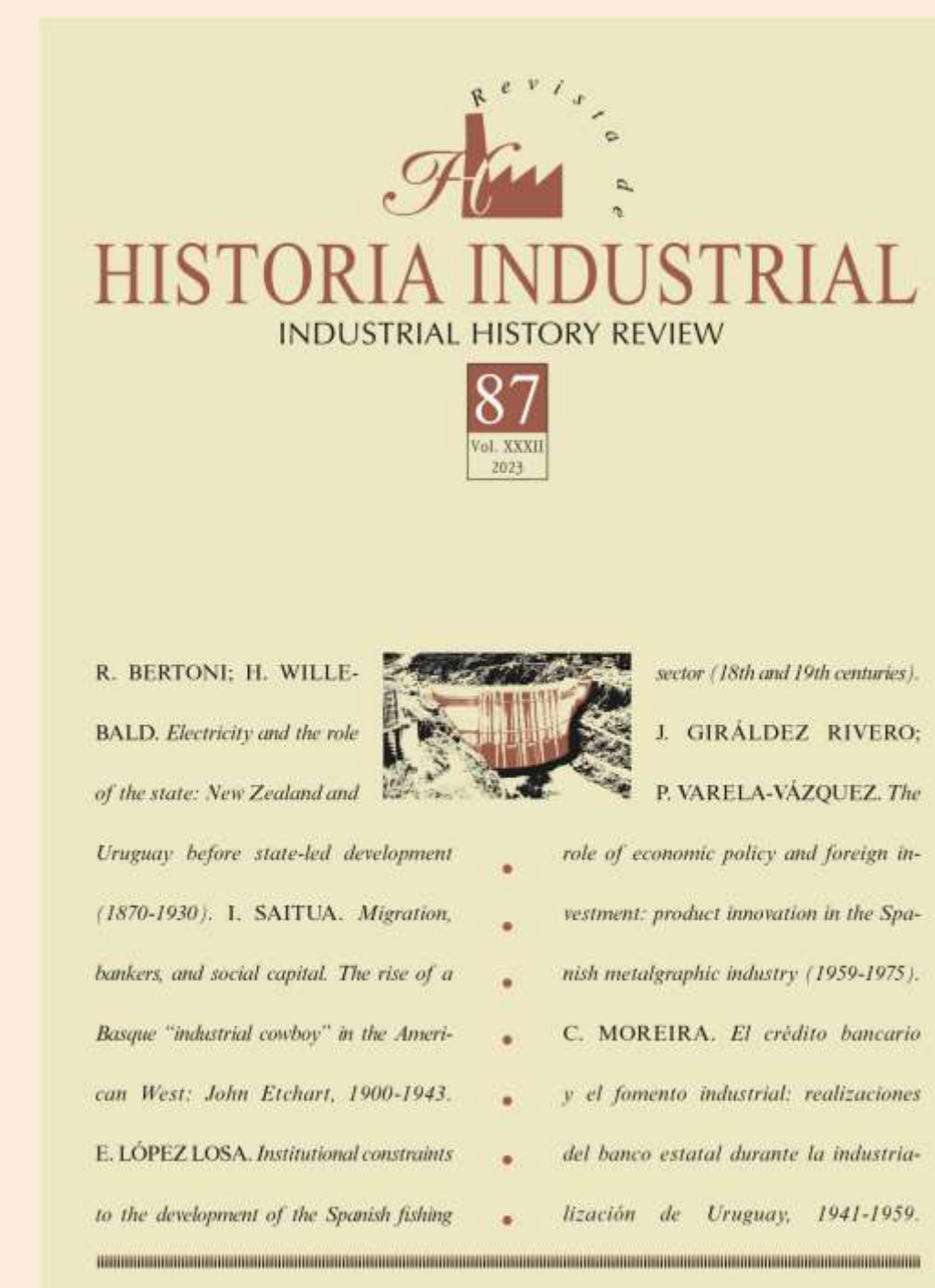
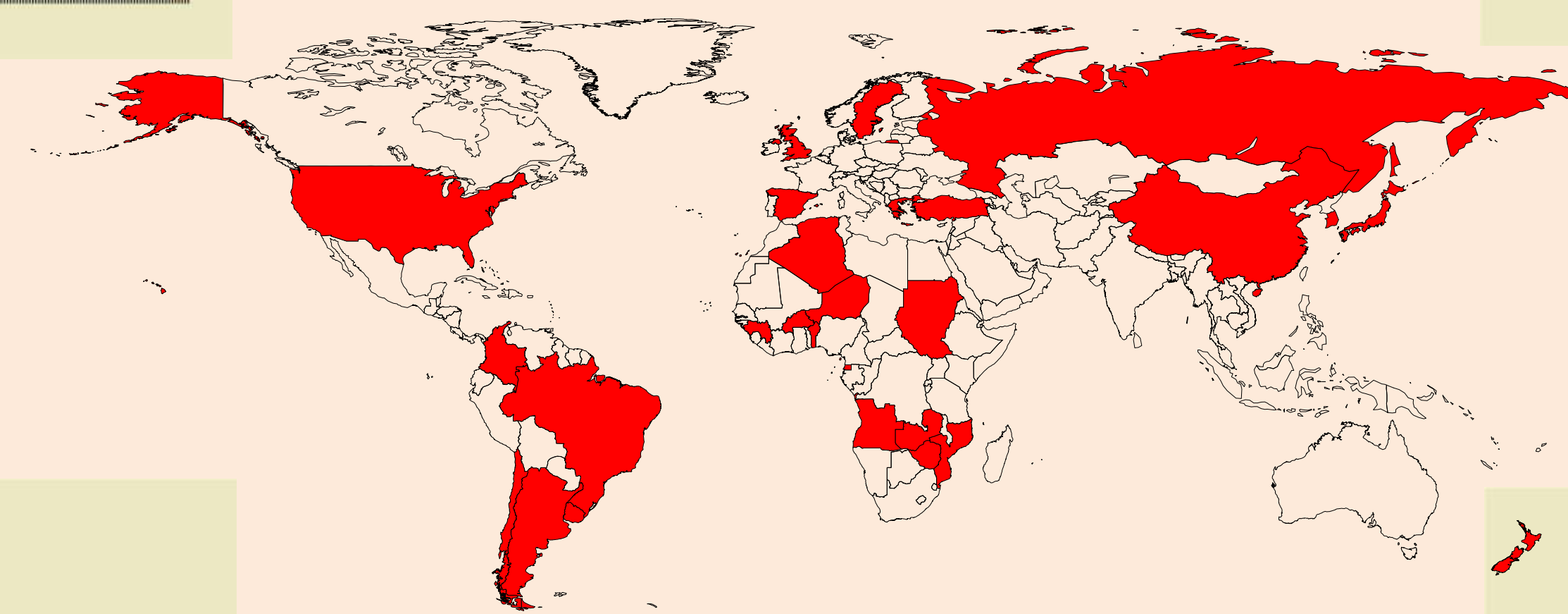


## 6 CONTENTS OF THE MOST RECENT ISSUES
