5 Two truths and a lie

Think of three sentences about your holidays, making two of them true and one of them a lie.

Example

- I've been to Cuba twice (true)
- I've canoed down the Ganges (lie)
- I've sailed in the East China Sea (true)

Tell the other students but do not say which one is the lie!

The other students should ask you questions and then decide which sentence is the lie.

Example

You: "I've been to Cuba twice!"

Other student: "When did you go there?"

You: "I went there 11 years ago, I think,

and then also last year."

Other student: "Who did you go with the first time?"

You: "My ex-boyfriend."

Other student: "What did you see?"

You: "I saw lots of Cadillacs; and I also

went to Heminaway's bar."

Other student: "That's a lie! You've never

been to Cuba!"

You: "Wrong, it's true!"
