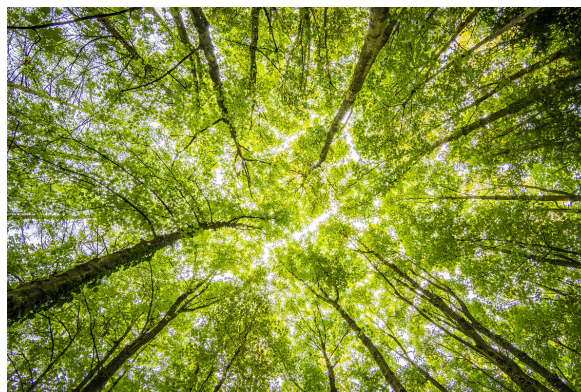
2 The effects of climate change
